NUNDU SCHOOL OF NURSING EXPANSION COMPLETION DATE – JULY1

Despite the frequent interruptions of war, Paul Ikocho, our Congolese contractor, reports the following good progress:

Friday May 8

The Nundu School of Nursing building project is progressing well. We are now finalizing the wall elevation, which we expect to complete next week. (this should be at the time of this publication) I have also received the funds for phases 4 and 5, which has helped us launch other works in parallel with the wall elevation (roof, windows, and ceilings). We have already started the preparation of the roof structure, including the trusses, and we have also started the preparation of the windows.

Friday May 15

I am currently in Uvira where I came to source some items for the project. The remainder of the wall elevation will be completed by Saturday, May 16. All the roof trusses are ready, and we are planning to begin mounting the roof structure next week.

Though improvements and expansion of the School of Nursing infrastructure are important, improving clinical instruction of midwives is equally important. For this reason, Dr. Luc, OB/GYN, has been visiting Nundu on a more regular basis which is making a significant difference.

STAFF HOUSING PROJECT

The leadership of Nundu Deaconess Hospital has determined that there is an urgent need for staff housing. Doctors in specialty training are scheduled to return to Nundu this year. Dr. Morgan will complete a pediatrics residency in July. Dr. Byamungu will complete a pediatric surgery fellowship in December. Dr. Baron will complete an OB/GYN residency in 2028.

Paul Ikocho, engineer, architect, and builder, has prepared a plan for a quadraplex which is projected to cost \$166,000. These plans have been approved by the CFC Advisory Council. We have received approval to use \$74,350 in our Melvin Spencer fund. An anonymous donor has given \$90,000, which will allow us to proceed with this project when the School of Nursing project is completed.



Staff housing will provide homes for four families.

There will be opportunities to assist in the purchase of appliances and furnishings.

Hospital Equipment & Medications

At NDH, the shelves meant to hold life-saving medications are often bare. Essential supplies run out far too frequently, leaving doctors helpless and patients vulnerable. Much of the hospital's equipment—once a lifeline—is now broken or dangerously outdated. Every day, medical staff must make impossible choices with the few tools they have left.

Fuel prices: Diesel fuel is now available and the price is normalizing, after rising to greater than three times the price prior to the war. We need \$1400 per month to cover this cost.

Starlink: Is now making internet more reliable, but the demand is exceeding the capacity of the service to which the hospital subscribed. Can we increase the capacity by providing more than \$100 per month?
